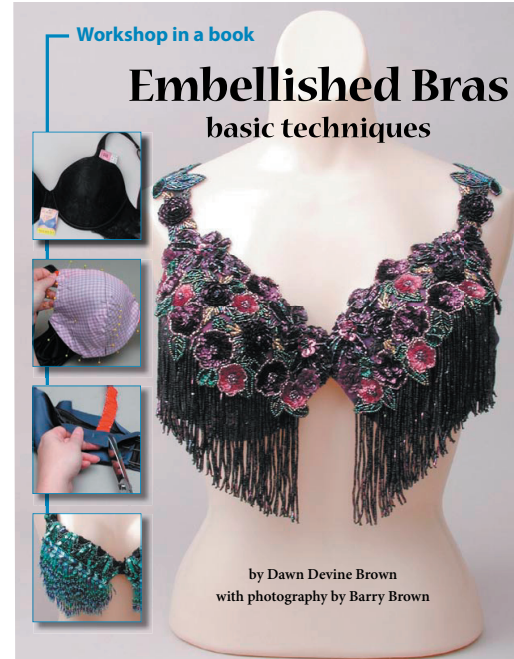

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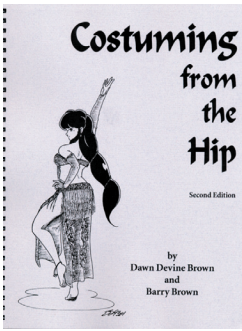

From simple sewing techniques to numerous design examples, this workshop in a book is an excellent resource for novice sewers and professional designers alike.

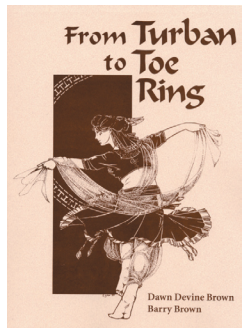

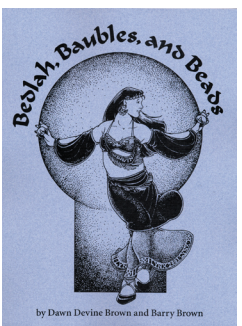

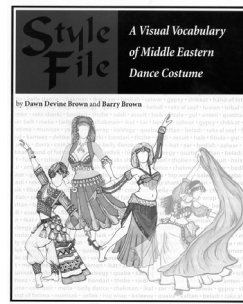

beautiful costumes to detailed directions for applying surface beading, this book is full of useful and thought provoking information for the dance costume maker.

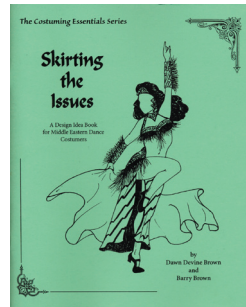

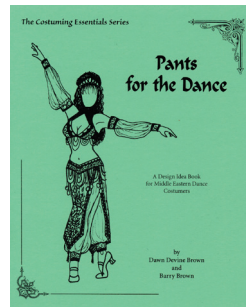
